Luke 13 tells us the parables of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast.

The point of both is the impact the gospel can have in our world. And by application, the influence each child of God can have in their circle or world. Even if we are not aware of the affect our lives have on family and friends, it still is there.

Often at funerals there are those who want to share something about the departed. It may be wisdom or a humorous moment that stands out in their mind when they remember the deceased. It is often touching to us.

The point here is they remember something. The question for each of us is, *what will they remember about me?* Oh, they will remember something, be it wise or funny or both. How we live our lives is like a Mustard Seed or the Yeast of the parable. You leave memories in the minds of others. 
