

It has always been difficult to be a man. The male has always been in the position of responsibility. It is a position that was coveted and often despised at the same time. Males impregnate women and then run away, escaping responsibility.

Older and primitive cultures often had a ritual that established when a boy became a man. The ritual could be anywhere from the onset of puberty to older teens success in hunting or even in battle. In our culture, there is no ritual, so it often becomes one that is created by the boy or his peers. It could be smoking or drinking before the legal age. Or it might be something legal like a driver's license or registering for the draft or joining the military. It might be immorality: fornication, criminal acts.

Books have been written and lectures given, but there is yet to be an unequivocal marker of when a boy becomes a man.

Personally, think it is a process that gradually grows as a boy begins to accept responsibility for what he does and who he is as a person. Yes, adolescence has a role, as does the development of the cerebral cortex around age 25. However, if a virile and rational thinking male does not accept responsibility for his actions and his role in society, he becomes a narcissistic cry baby and perhaps even a criminal.

Wait! Does that sound like many in our society today? Who, at the same time, bristle at the hint that they are not men.

The application also applies to the female. Yes, menses is a marker, but not of maturity. The struggle to be responsible for who you are, is the same.

How do parents and adults help a child to become an adult? Recognize the times they accept responsibility. Compliment, don't punish them for accepting blame. Let them try, fail and try again. Give them freedom and encouragement to succeed.
