# Together

"A kindhearted woman gains respect, but ruthless men gain only wealth. A kind man benefits himself, but a cruel man brings himself harm." Proverbs 11:16-17

Kindness is always appreciated when it is directed toward us. If it is an encouraging word or an unexpected gift it is pleasing because it is appreciated and because it is unexpected. Be Thankful for every act of kindness.

Our God encourages us to be kind to others, not just to expect it from them. It is good to be treated kindly, but are we doing the same. Some may fantasize about the good and kind things they would do if they suddenly received a billion dollars. But, what are we doing with what we have. Kind words and respect toward others does not require money, not even a little bit.

The apostle Paul speaks to this in 1 Cor 13 when he describes love (agape). It is an action: patient, kind, not envy, not boast, not proud, not rude, not self-seeking, not easily angered, keeps no record of wrongs, does not enjoy evil, but rejoices with truth. Protects, trusts, hopes, perseveres. None of these require wealth.

There are at least two expressions which will help us be kind: "Benefit of the doubt" and "Don't jump to conclusions."

While the evil in this world requires us to be on guard for potential danger, it does not mean we must suspect that family, friends and acquaintances are always plotting to take advantage of us or our family. Give the benefit of believing they have good intentions, expect the best not the worst.

More importantly, be your best in every situation. While it is easy to expect the best from others, it is more difficult to always be our best. When we are kind toward others, it is easier for them to accept us when we fail to reach our best. Seek to be kind and to always do your best.

Most of us hope to be loved and respected which means we should live in such a way that it comes naturally from others.

Sermon: A Kingdom Torn in Two Scripture: 1 Kgs 11:42—12:5

#### STAGES OF GRIEF

Kubler-Ross published the Five Stages of Grief as the process which terminally ill patients went through when told of their imminent death. Soon it was applied to grieving family and friends. It can be applied to other types of loss as well: divorce, addiction, just about anything that hurts. The acronym DABA stands for the stages.

DENIAL - This can't be happening to me. This is like a period of shock. We see a tragic event unfolding before our eyes, but it does not seem real – but it is. ANGER - Typically directed anyone and everyone because what is happening is not fair. Even Christians, who know better, will ask: "Why did God do this?" BARGAINING - Accustomed to solving problems, mankind seeks for a solution. Occasionally with the doctor, usually with God – What if ...? DEPRESSION - A sadness from which there is no

escape. Making yourself smile or telling lots of jokes, even visiting an amusement park doesn't help.

ACCEPTANCE - There is no time frame for reaching this phase. Faith in God helps us handle all kinds of

loss, even those for which we are responsible. It is the recognition of what has happened, but setting the course to continue on with life.

Jesus knew he was going to die. As it drew nigh, he even prayed for an escape, when denied, he faced his destiny. Your most dear loved one would not wish for their loved ones to spend the rest of life in grief, but to carry on the love and share it. A lost job, a broken marriage, or a physical disability, all bring pain, but with God's help you can continue.

Everyone will experience grief during their lifetime. The challenge is to not be overcome by the loss. Each one probably knows a person who will not get over a great loss. They often live in anger and depression with seemingly a drive to pull others into their sadness. They don't lose friends, but they drive them away with their incessant and often explosive "you don't understand" attitude. Lean on your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. This world is not our home.
