The early church was a different culture than we experience. Transportation was mostly walking. Shopping for food in the market place was a daily necessity. It was likely to see other disciples during the course of the week. Yet, some fell into the practice of not meeting with their fellow Christians to worship and study.

The NIV translates “not give up.” The KJV reads “do not forsake.” NLT “not neglect.” Message “not avoiding.” and NEB “not staying away.” Whatever the translation, each is reflecting the decision taken by the disciple. You decide!

In today’s world of transportation, extended hours of shopping and refrigeration of food, it is not unusual to spend a week without seeing a fellow disciple out in the world. It is common to see our brothers and sister in Christ, only when we gather to worship and study. It is a joy to assemble with those of faith. When you are away, you are missed. I miss you.

Why was it necessary for disciples in the first century to be urged to be regular in their attendance? They were human. It was inconvenient because you did not get the weekend off. You often worked 7 days a week. You were tired, you had to walk and perhaps your faith was slipping.

Today, companies often give vacation time in the summer. Unheard of in the first century. Today, there are frequent holidays off and lobbyists of the travel industry, convinced Congress to move most to Monday for a longer weekend. There is the weekend to visit family. Suddenly, we have missed 2 or 3 for vacation, then 6 long weekends, extra 2-5 for weddings, funerals or birthdays, not feeling well 1-3. Before you know it we have missed 20 or more Sundays. It is our job to encourage the weak in faith not become the weak.

PETS IN HEAVEN

Many have enjoyed pets during their lifetime. It is possible to become emotionally attached to your dog, cat or other pet. Some become so attached that human characteristics are credited to the pet. Perhaps cartoons depicting animals acting like humans have contributed to the fantasy. There are stuffed animals that talk when a cord is pulled. It is as if we are conditioned from childhood to see animals as humans.

There was an article titled something like: "If Dogs aren't in Heaven, I don't want to Go." Sounds extreme. However, a person once said to me that if their dog could not stay in my house on an overnight visit, they would not be coming either. This was not a guide dog or service dog, just a big, shaggy pet.

Think what this says about the relationship a person has with God, when they choose a pet over God.

Hopefully, what the person is trying to express is the desire to have total and complete acceptance.

Pets give this because you take care of them. When you come home, it doesn't matter if you are happy, sad, angry or terrified, they are glad to see you. But, why? Because you take care of them: feed, water, comfort and protect. From a practical point of view, you are their god.
