The vision received by Peter in Acts 10 is very important. First, it echo's the message that the previous covenant that YHWH had made with Israel through Moses is no longer in effect. This seems to be well understood by Peter as manifested by his preaching of Jesus as Messiah. However, the application that the Messiah came to save all the world has not yet been realized in Peter's mind.

Peter had to learn that not only could he eat catfish and pork, he could preach to the Gentiles as well. From Peter's point of view, either one was just about as repulsive as the other. "Unclean" is the warning and he did not want to do anything that would jeopardize his relationship with YHWH.

You have to admire Peter's determination to stay away from things that would harm his relationship with YHWH. We all should have to same grit to avoid sin and even temptation. But, first we must know the full message from God.

Prejudice is not based on previous experience. It is usually based on something we have been told from others. Their experience may not be accurate or comes from a misunderstanding.
