

Mexico/Chiapas Mission

Recently it was brought to my attention that there appears to be some slight confusion regarding how best to support the work of the Carrillo family. The first thing you need to understand is that the work in Chiapas continues as Enrique oversees the local preachers by providing video lessons, sermons, bible lessons for children. He consults with the preachers regularly. The support for this work is coming from sources outside the Eastwood Family. However, the family sustenance has dwindled to almost nothing. Several Eastwood members have indicated a willingness to give support but want also a record of donations be kept by the church for IRS purposes. This is how it should be done: ALL money for this

purpose should be given to the church. I've learned that some members question this practice and are uncomfortable doing so. But Eastwood Church has always done this mainly to protect the givers as well as the receivers. The church as a 501c entity affords its members to use their donation as a deductible item on their tax returns. All monies collected are guaranteed by the eldership to be received by the appropriate recipients. 1. If you write a check, you must indicate on the check that this is for the Mexico Missions. Tracking donations in this manner is the easiest way to work with your donation. 2. If you prefer to donate cash, you must place it in one of the envelopes provided and address it to the Mexico Missions Fund or if you wish address it to the Carrillo's Mission Fund. Now, this is important. You must identify the envelope showing who it's from. If you don't identify the envelope then you MUST include along with the money a note identifying who it is from. This is important if you want credit for IRS purposes. The church office will maintain a ledger for this purpose.

I hope that this helps you better understand how the Eastwood Church works to finance its missions.



Don't accept sin because it has become fashionable.


Invaluable!
