

## Sugar A Sin

It has been frequently stated in Bible class hour that sin is the expansion of a gift from God. God created humankind with the ability have pleasure, mankind ruins it by going to extremes. Man is commanded to work and provide for self and family. Greed is when man goes to an extreme. We must eat in order to live, but gluttony is a sin.

Food is pleasing to the taste and everyone enjoys a good meal. Then comes dessert which 99.9% of the time is a sweet dish. We enjoy the sweetness, so much that we even have dessert after a huge meal.

Honey is translated 57 times in ASV and 61 times in Young's Literal Tran. The one who first discovered the tastiness of honey must have thought they had found food from heaven. Sweet is good.

Is sweetness a sin? Only if we make it so. This is the hard part. We live in an age where food is ample but unfortunately most has had sweetness added to it. It is as if the food industry is trying to kill. But we buy what tastes good, so added sweetness is ubiquitous. It has many names: Dextrose, Fructose, Galactose, Glucose, Lactose, Maltose, Sucrose, Beet sugar, Brown sugar, Cane juice crystals, Cane sugar, Castor sugar, Coconut sugar, Confectioner's sugar (powdered sugar), Corn syrup solids, Crystalline, fructose, Date sugar, Demerara sugar, Dextrin, Diastatic malt, Ethyl maltol, Florida crystals, Golden sugar, Glucose syrup solids, Grape sugar, Icing sugar, Maltodextrin, Muscovado sugar, Panela sugar, Raw sugar, Sugar (granulated), Sucanat, Turbinado

sugar, Yellow sugar, Agave Nectar/Syrup, Barley malt, Blackstrap molasses, Brown rice syrup, Buttered sugar/buttercream, Caramel, Carob syrup, Corn syrup, Evaporated cane juice, Fruit juice, Fruit juice concentrate, Golden syrup, High-Fructose Corn Syrup, Honey, Invert sugar, Malt syrup, Maple syrup, Molasses, Rice syrup, Refiner's syrup, Sorghum syrup, Treacle.

How much sugar can I have a day? The American Heart Association recommends: For men: No more than 36 grams of added sugar per day. For women: No more than 25 grams of added sugar per day.

Added sugars aren't just found in sweets. Foods such as salad dressings, ketchup and even tomato sauce can also have added sugar. So can drinks. For example, one scoop of vanilla ice cream can have 14 grams of added sugar. A 12-ounce soda can have 39 grams. To stay within the recommended range, it helps to check nutrition labels and minimize your consumption of ultra-processed foods, which have been linked with chronic diseases. Diabetes, heart, cancer.

It makes one cringe to see a person with a 48oz of sugared drink, in addition to the other carbohydrates in their meal. There is a strong likelihood they will get a drink refill.

Carbohydrates like bread, potatoes, rice and corn just add to the problem. Take care of yourself. 1 Cor 3:16-17; 6:19-20; 10:31; Rom 12:1; 1 Tim 5:8Is sweetness a sin? Only if we make it so.
