Fellowship is frequently used to describe a social gathering by Christians. It is typically used as in Fellowship dinner to describe when disciples come together for a meal. This is an accurate use of the word.

However, it has deeper meaning. In Greek the word is koinonía *koinwnia* and it is also translated communion. The word speaks of a sharing or participation in a common interest. As when you are a stranger in a crowd and coincidently meet someone from your hometown. Or in this scenario a fellow Christian and you are immediately connected.

On the first day of the week, disciples gather to eat the Lord's Supper and worship the God of our salvation. We are connected to one another and to the Divine. We have communion, not just in the eating of the bread and drinking of the cup, but with each other. We are Together.

Fellowship is not just on the first day of the week, which we call Sunday. It is to be a part of our life on every day. Who in the world would we rather be with than those who on our team, in our family, have the same goals and follow the same Savior.

Fellowship needs to be developed. In the family of God the door is open to all. We may be closer to some because of other mutual interests, but NO ONE is shut out. In fact, each and every disciple should make an effort to reach out to others. Some may seem to have lots of friends, but they also need to be connected to you. Others may be cautious and need fellowship with you most of all.

Imagine the first century disciples as they work together: the citizen of Rome and the non-citizen, the Roman soldier and those who fear him, the freeman and the slave, the master and slave. Yet, they had "everything in common." Acts 4:32


Reach out to a fellow disciple this week. Get to know them and make a new friend. After all, we will spend eternity Together. *Charles M. Clodfelter*

Love That Surpasses Knowledge

How wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ. —Ephesians 3:18

It's hard to imagine that Jesus voluntarily went from being worshipped by angels to sleeping in an animal feeding trough—gave up equality with God to become human (Phil 2:6–7).

At this season, we think about what he did. And I hope we think about why he did it. He did it because that's what love does: it puts those who are loved ahead of self-concern. Your place in heaven was more important to Jesus than his place in heaven, so he gave up his so you could have yours. He "loved [you] and gave himself up for [you]" (Eph 5:2).

Can you comprehend that? I confess I can't. "The love of Christ surpasses knowledge" Eph 3:19

But that's what love does—perfect love, sacrificial love, heavenly love. Think about that when you think of the manger.

Have you ever neared the completion of a jigsaw puzzle, only to discover that a piece or two is missing? That's an apt visual for what it's like to live without God. Blaise Pascal, a 17th-century philosopher, observed: "There is a God-shaped vacuum in the heart of each man which cannot be satisfied by any created thing but only by God the Creator, made known through Jesus Christ."

Centuries earlier, St. Augustine proclaimed "Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in thee." And in the Old Testament, the writer of Ecclesiastes expounded on the meaninglessness of earthly striving and material pursuits. Only God's Spirit can fill our emptiness and satisfy our eternal longings.

"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full," says Jesus in John 10:10 (NIV). He alone provides the solution for emptiness. What comfort to be filled with — and to find our fulfillment in — our Savior!

First, contact

In Unclean: Meditations on Purity, Hospitality and Mortality, Richard Beck writes powerfully about Jesus healing a leper in Matthew 8:1-3. "What is intriguing about this story is the sequence. Jesus touches the leper first. Then the command 'Be clean!' is offered. That is, Jesus' first move is into ritual defilement. By first touching the leper, Jesus ... [is] standing in solidarity with the unclean." Beck finds this "striking" because typically we expect purification before contact. But Jesus' actions reverse the pattern: "Contact occurs first."

How fortunate for us, too, that God didn't wait to reach out to us until he had cleansed us of sin. God didn't save us from afar and only *then* come to live among us. Rather, "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8, ESV). And continuously, Jesus loves us, comes to us and touches our hearts, even when we are at our worst — straying from God, trapped in sin, unworthy, unclean, unrighteous.
