

FUDIES SHOW MISSING CHURCH DOUBLES DEMENTIA RISK.

Actually, the danger is even greater, but I did make up the caption. Did it do the job and get your attention? It seems that everyday an article begins with a similar title, telling us to eat this or don't eat this and usually ends by urging us to buy a product. We see dementia in our family and loved ones and it makes us fearful. We ask, "what caused it" and "how can I avoid it?" It is frightening! We would give up our favorite foods and activities to avoid getting dementia.

What is MUCH worse is sin and how it separates us from Jesus. The research is still out on what causes dementia, but we know what separates us from God! Sin lures us into situations that are incompatible with godly living. It often happens so gradually, we are not even aware what is happening until we are shocked at where we are and how we got there.

The irony of it is, while we would give up our favorite foods and activities to avoid the dreaded dementia, we will not give them up to avoid sin and separation from Jesus. Our priorities become shewed over the pleasure of the moment and the consequences of actions. There was a bowling alley that offered a 90% discount from midnight Saturday till 4 a.m. Sunday. Is bowling a sin? No, but by the time You got home about 4:30 or 5 a.m. it was not likely you would make it to worship.

"Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching." Hebrews 10:25

Why should Christians assemble? Does God want our worship? Yes. Does he need our worship? No. WE need to worship. We need to be reminded, we need to encourage our fellow disciples.

Some are more dedicated to a sports team or a TV show than they are to the Lord Jesus. You've never missed a game or an episode of the show. Sunday Morning Sermon Speaker - Charles Clodfelter

> Sermon: He is Risen Scripture: Luke 24:1-8

Doctrinal Issue 3

John Wycliffe, an Englishman and priest, produced an English translation circa 1380. This allowed more to read what the Bible said, instead of having to rely on what the priest/church told them. It planted the seed for questions that challenged the Roman denomination. The anger against Wycliffe resulted in his bones being exhumed and burned, 100 years after his death.

The Gutenberg printing press was invented in 1440 and Bibles were quickly available to even more.

Martin Luther, a priest in the Roman denomination, became displeased with the errors he saw. In 1517, he drafted 95 Theses or propositions that attacked the Roman denomination practice of selling "indulgences" to absolve sin. These protests were the beginning of what came to be known as the Protestant Reformation as other priests also began to speak against what they saw as errors in Roman denomination doctrine.

Huldrych (Ulrich) Zwingli 1519, John Calvin 1536, John Knox 1540, Jacobus Armnius 1630 and many others were among those who sought to reform or correct errors they saw in the Roman denomination.

The Roman Catholic denomination was basically formed when Roman Emperor Constantine granted tolerance to Christianity in 313 AD. Subsequently organized similar to the Roman empire it was set up with a Pope, Cardinals, Archbishops, Bishops, Priests. Overtime the Pope gained political power and a king was not a king unless ordained or approved by the Pope. So, the Roman denomination and political pow-

er of the government were deeply intertwined.

King Henry VIII of England wanted an heir to his throne. Blaming his wife for not having a son, Henry wanted an annulment to marry another wife, the church/Pope refused. So, the Church of England was formed (1530s) with Henry as its head. There were many reformers in England at the time, but the desire for a son, seems to be the trigger.

Most of those we label Reformers, continued to accept the Augustine view of Inherited Sin. But, their focus was not universal, they disagreed with one another of other issues. All were sincere with a deep faith in God, Jesus and the Holy Spirit. Even though some were willing to follow the Roman denomination practice of killing those who disagreed with them.

They sought to handle the difficulty of "original sin" in different ways. Those who are often called Mainline churches usually practice Paedobaptism or infant baptism, believing this washes the new born clean of the sin of Adam. Those called Evangelical believe you are guilty of, but not accountable for Adam's sin until you reach the age of accountability. As you recall, Pelagius went to Ireland where he continued to preach the doctrine of Free Will.

The way to be undenominational is to return to the teaching of the New Testament. It is easy and simple but difficult because if you start with the wrong premise you will be wrong and along the way, we all form opinions that could be erroneous.



Sharing our Easter inheritance

After David Clarke's mother died in a cycling accident, she left him \$125,000. Inspired by how his mom had lived, he decided to share that inheritance with his community. Clarke chose four organizations that assist people in poverty, those with special needs and others. Liverpool (U.K.) Kids Plant to Plate received one-fourth of the money to teach urban kids about food growth and preparation. Team Oasis, which provides free meals and positive opportunities to disadvantaged families, also received 25% of the funds, as did two other nonprofits.

Through Jesus' death and resurrection, we too have an inheritance (see Colossians 1:12). Because we did nothing to earn this abundant love and life — and because God teaches us to serve and care for others — we look for ways to share it.

Unlike Clarke's monetary windfall, however, our gifts of salvation, grace, joy, love and blessing never run out. In fact, the more we share Jesus' love through word and deed, the more we experience it ourselves. As Clarke keeps his mom's spirit alive by following her example, so we, as Easter people, make the Spirit of God known far and wide.
