

1 ogether

The resurrection of Jesus from the tomb is the core of the Gospel. The resurrection tells all mankind that Jesus is Divine, the Son of God, the Messiah, anointed by YHWH to be the Savior for all of humanity, who will be his disciples. Disciples celebrate his coming forth from the tomb every first day of the week with the communion or Lord's Supper.

Resurrection is discussed in great detail in Paul's letter to the Corinthians, 1 Cor 15. It seems the resurrection was difficult for some of the early Christians to understand. Earlier Paul appears to address a misunderstanding in 1 Thessalonians 4, where some had come to the position that those who died before Jesus returned would miss heaven.

In First Corinthians, it appears that a few were giving up on the idea of resurrection all together. Paul addresses this by asking the question, why are we doing this?

Just because we do not and cannot have a complete understanding of every question that might be raised, does not mean that the resurrection is not true. He began chapter 15 with the witnesses to the resurrection, none of whom recanted their testimony even at the point of death. Even Paul faced wild beasts as a result of his preaching the Gospel.

If there is no resurrection, Paul wrote, we should all just live lives of self indulgence because it doesn't matter what we do in this world. Then he explains with an example all can understand, planting a seed. Even today, we know enough about planting seed that we can understand. There is a difference in the heavenly and the earthly. We cannot go to heaven with our present bodies, we must be changed and death is part of that change.

"Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is Your victory? Where, O death, is your sting.?"

Death is part of the process that helps us be able to go to the heavenly place we all desire. Victory over death is ours because of the resurrection of Jesus and our resurrection. Death is not to be feared, but embraced. Yes, we love others and want the best for them. Just as Paul wrote, "I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart to be with Christ...but remain on your account." Phil 1:23.

God wants us to love others as He loves us


Years ago a young sociology professor at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore assigned his class a project. They were to interview 200 city teen boys residing in downtown slums and predict their futures. The students predicted that ninety percent of the teens would end up in prison at some point.


Twenty-five years later the same professor asked another class to track down the original boys. One hundred eighty were located but only four had ever been in jail. Why were the predictions so wrong? Looking for common factors, the students noticed that more than one hundred boys had mentioned the same teacher, Mrs. O'Rourke, from their local public school. The sociology students searched for and finally located a seventy-year-old Sheila O'Rourke in a Memphis nursing home. Puzzled by the interest in her, she said simply, "All I ever did was love each of them." The more we love Him, the more we love those around us.


The Lenten desert

During the Lenten season, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5 this year), Christians figuratively follow Jesus into the desert. Just as our Savior spent 40 days fasting and facing temptation, we focus on selfreflection and contrition.

In an 1873 hymn, Claudia Hernaman wrote, "O Lord, throughout these forty days, you prayed and kept the fast. Inspire repentance for our sin, and free us from our past."

The desert experience of Lent serves a clear purpose, filling us up rather than depleting us. "This is what Lent is meant to be," writes theologian Ron Rolheiser. "Time in the desert to courageously face the chaos and the demons within us and to let God do battle with them through us. The result is that we are purified, made ready, so the intoxicating joy of Easter might then bind us more closely to God and each other."

In Matthew 5:13-16 Jesus tells his followers, "You are the salt of the earth. ... You are the light of the world." Through his example, our Savior showed us what that means.

"The remarkable thing is that Jesus brought it all into reality in his own person," writes Bible scholar N.T. Wright in Matthew for Everyone. "He was the salt of the earth. He was the light of the world: set up on a hilltop, crucified for all the world to see, becoming a beacon of hope and new life for everybody, drawing people to worship his [F]ather, embodying the way of self-giving love which is the deepest [fulfillment] of the law and the prophets."
